Welcome to Penpals Interactive

Penpals for Handwriting is a complete handwriting scheme for 3 to 11-year olds, covering Foundation 1 to Year 6, and is fully in line with the English National Curriculum and all other UK National Curricula.

- Right click and select Extract All. The software should create a new folder

Penpals Interactive should now appear in your Applications folder. You can launch Penpals Interactive from here. You can also drag the icon to your dock to launch the software from a more convenient location.

MSI

The .msi will be in a separate folderin teh downloaded zip file labelled 'MSI' which will be used to for deploying the installation over the network.

Opening Penpals Interactive

After installation, a *Penpals Interactive* icon will appear on your desktop. Each time you want to use *Penpals Interactive*, just double-click on your desktop icon.

Terms and conditions
